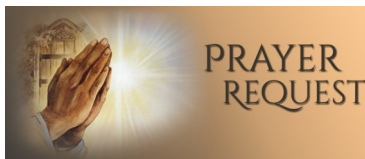

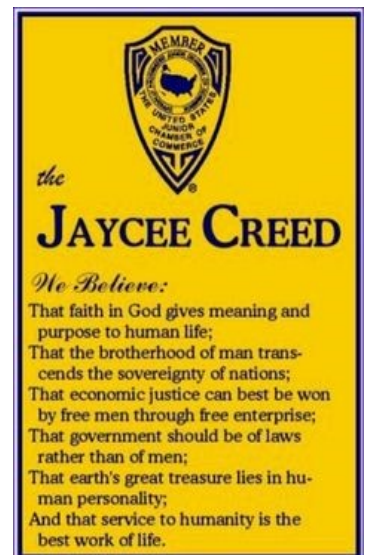
We are very excited about seeing you all in Jekyll Island! I am hoping that we have a great crowd.
