


### Chaplin....



### Words from the 2020 Incoming Commander.....

I would like to thank my fellow colonels for electing me as the 2020 Ga Jaycees Honor Corps Commander. Honestly, I never thought I would be able to achieve this distinguished office. I promise to do everything in my power to ensure the success of the Ga Jaycees Honor Corps in 2020 put for many years to come!!

Our theme for 2020 is "**It's Up To Us..."** It's Up To Us to ensure that the Georgia Jaycee Honor Corps is still a viable organization in 2028 for our 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and for many, many years to come. In order to ensure our future, I believe there are some items that we need to focus on in 2020. Below are some of the main things I believe we need to discuss. I will provide more detail and thoughts in Savannah.

- Purpose Over the past few years, we have had only between 30 40 colonels pay yearly dues. What reason do the non-Life Members have to pay their dues?? What benefit do colonels get for paying their dues other than admittance to hospitality. What can we offer those colonels we seldom see to become more involved? Do we revisit our current dues structure??
- **Hospitality** With attendance at our meetings dwindling, is hospitality in its current form feasible?? This past August in Newnan, there were less than 35 colonels who paid ribbon fees. For the weekend, hospitality ended up costing just over \$600 (\$400 for the Corps and \$200 for the Senate). If we can improve our purpose as mentioned above and encourage more participation at our meetings, we should be able to at a minimum break even on hospitality. Our bartenders and hospitality coordinators do an excellent job setting up and providing an enjoyable weekend for those who attend.
- **Communication** I believe that we need to fully partner with the Ga JCI Senate to ensure the continued success of both organizations. Our availability of new membership for both organizations is dwindling. By working side by side, I believe both organizations can continue to survive for years to come.
- **Georgia Jaycees** If we can help ensure the future of the Georgia Jaycees, we can ensure potential membership for our organization. Taking from our old Jaycee days, I would like to establish Honor Corps Region Directors. These region directors would stay in contact with the Jaycee chapters in their area to make other colonels aware of meetings and projects of their chapters. Promotion and participation with the Ge Jaycees is critical for the long term success of our organizations. I will be reaching out to colonels throughout the states to serve in this vital role.

These are some of the things that I believe we need to focus on in the coming Honor Corps year. I am certain there are more things that we can do to ensure our future. I will be challenging the Long Range Planning Committee to review these and any other items that need to be addressed. I am open and available to listen to any thoughts any fellow colonels might have. I look forward to the coming year as we begin the conversations to ensure the Ga Jaycee Honor Corps remains viable for many, many years.

Thank you for your support and remember to finish Commander Andrea's year on a high note.


